Letter dated July 7, 2000 for a Clinical Neurology Department in Germany

Good morning dear Mr . . .

As discussed by phone, we would like to inform you of two very positive side effects from the electrostatic filters, which we installed in three departments:

We started the filters in March this year, and visitors to our clinic as well as our service personnel found that the odor of feces, unfortunately until now inevitable in intensive care rooms, have been completely eliminated.

We became aware of this very clearly, when we had to shut down one of the filters for reasons of maintenance.

The "inevitable odor of feces" became very noticeable. 15 minutes after the restart of the electrostatic filters the odors immediately disappeared. In this way, it was found that your air purification system can eliminate in a highly effective way even such strong smells.

Both staff and patients agree that your filters provide a good indoor climate, even with high outside temperatures, without creating drafts.

A detailed report, including laboratory results, on the efficiency of the filters with regard to limitation of infections and their prevention will be sent in the coming weeks.
